# Cameron Miclette



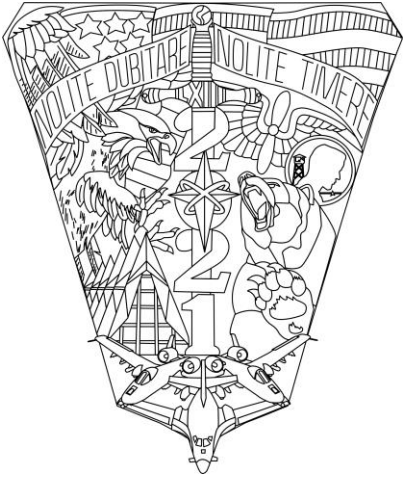

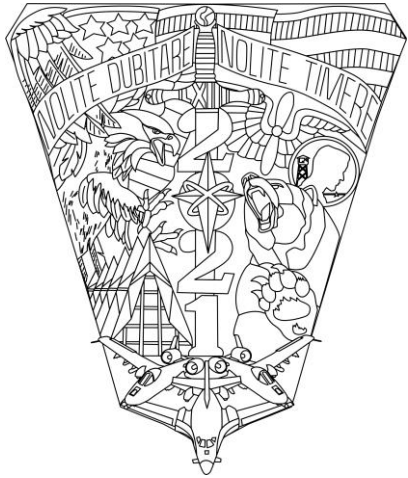
